TRANSITIONAL PLANNING

A. Early Childhood Transition Process

- 1. Transitional Planning for children with special needs entering the school system should be initiated one year before school entry.
- 2. Information will be shared at the Early Childhood Committee meeting held in May one year before school entry.
- 3. The Assistant Superintendent of Student Services will then schedule a transitional planning meeting to identify the child's needs and plan for successful school entry.

B. Students with Special Needs Reaching 16 Transition Process

- 1. Transitional planning is mandated for all students 16 years of age or older who require government supports after leaving school.
- 2. The case manager initiates this process by arranging a transitional planning meeting, including parents and other agency representatives as appropriate, during the student's 16th year.
- 3. The student's transition planning team continues to meet at least once per year until the student graduates from school.
