Scholarship and Bursary Information

Scholarships are awarded to students to assist with the cost of university, college or other post-secondary training. The criteria for scholarships will differ and may include academic achievements, community involvement, volunteer work, extra-curricular activities, personal interests, athleticism, as well as, the program they plan to commence leading to their future career.

Bursaries are awards that are given to students with financial need being a major factor in the criteria for the award

The criteria for scholarships will differ and may include academic achievements, community involvement, volunteer work, extra-curricular activities, personal interests, athleticism, as well as the program the student plans to study.

Some tips:

- Be prepared to do some research to find scholarships that meet your unique situation.
- Look through scholarship websites in Manitoba and check which awards are available from the university or college that you plan to attend.
- SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA: It is important to read over the scholarship criteria when searching for scholarships. For example, entrance scholarships to U of M and U of W require the average in the best of five approved 40S courses. Not all 40S courses are eligible. Every school is different so be sure to check out their individual websites. Also, don't assume scholarships and bursaries are based solely on marks. Often, awards look at the whole person and are very interested to see your volunteerism, leadership, and initiative.
- Ask someone to proofread your application or essay. It is easy to overlook errors in your own writing.
- Be involved with school, volunteer and community organizations. Keep a detailed list of all activities.
- Register for scholarship search engines listed below. These will help you narrow your search and will match you up with available scholarships and bursaries.
- College Applications: If you meet the general requirements for the preferred program you can apply. Applications are on a first come- first accepted format. The earlier you apply in your grade 12 year the better, to avoid a waiting list. Entrance requirements may change annually as it is a competitive field and often entrance is based on demand.
- Universities: Recommend early application (Before Christmas) and residence as well.
- Students must meet the general entrance requirements of each university/college. Each university/college sets application deadlines. Meeting these deadlines, and excellent academic standing qualifies the student for entrance scholarships. APPLY EARLY!!! Check the available entrance scholarships and bursary opportunities for your college/university.

Note that the province of Manitoba requires you to complete 30 credit hours for graduation (17 mandatory credits and a minimum of 13 electives). On the chart below, your required courses are in bold. Note that in Turtle Mountain School Division, students are required to take Grade 9 Life/Work Exploration. Also note that if you take a 40 level elective in grade 11, it is still counted as a 40 level course and will be recorded with your grade 12 courses. You can also access your courses through Xello (new version of Career Cruising).

Autobiographical Essay Format

Below you will find a brief outline of what to include in each paragraph of your autobiographical essay. Next you will find a breakdown of how to write each paragraph. Finally I have created a frame where you can actually write your essay. Remember to vary your sentence openers and to use transition words so the reader is able to easily follow your essay.

- 1. Introduction
 - a. Tell a story attention grabbing vocabulary choice is important
 - i. Personal values
 - ii. Personal strengths
- 2. Past accomplishments
 - a. Accomplishments/Achievements
 - i. Academic
 - ii. Other achievements (extra-curricular athletic and non-athletic)
- 3. Future goals and plans
 - a. What are your realistic goals and plans
 - b. Where are you in reaching those goals what steps have you taken?
 - c. What course of study have you set for yourself?
- 4. Why you deserve to be considered
 - a. Why should you be awarded the scholarship why do you need it?
 - b. What would you do with the scholarship
 - c. How will it make reaching your goals possible?
- 5. Conclusion
 - a. Tie back to the opening
 - i. refer to the lesson learned through your story in your introduction
 - ii. restate how this lesson has helped you today tie them into the big picture
 - iii. how did this lesson lead you to your future goals

Paragraph one: Introduction

Your introduction has 3 parts:

- Sentence 1: a killer first line
- o Body sentences: a detailed description of an experience from your life
- Pivot sentence(s): transition to the bigger picture, where you explain why and how this experience has shaped you, your point of view, your values. Remember to highlight your values and strengths.

Step 1: decide which life event you will share and what you expect that life event to demonstrate to the reader about you and the kind of person that you are.

Sentence one: Start with a "killer" first sentence. This will grab the attention of your reader and make them want to continue reading. There are different kinds of starting sentences to choose from. Below you will find 5 different ideas for your first sentence. Choose one.

First Sentence Idea 1: Line of Quoted Direct Speech

First Sentence Idea 2: Punchy Short Sentence With One Grabby Detail

I live alone — I always have since elementary school. (Kevin Zevallos '16 for Connecticut College)

First Sentence Idea 3: Lyrical, Adjective-Rich Description of a Setting

First Sentence Idea 4: The End – Making the Rest of the Essay a Flashback

I've recently come to the realization that community service just isn't for me. (*Kyla '19 for Johns Hopkins University*)

First Sentence Idea 5: Lesson You Learned From the Story You're Telling

Perhaps it wasn't wise to chew and swallow a handful of sand the day I was given my first sandbox, but it seemed like a good idea at the time. (<u>Meagan Spooner '07 for Hamilton College</u>)

Body of the introductory paragraph: Develop a few vivid sentences to elaborate on your first sentence. This is your detailed description of an experience from your life. Tell your story.

Pivot sentence(s) – **last sentence(s) of the introduction (may take up to 3 sentences)** – Include a pivot sentence to connect this story to your purpose for applying. It is an insightful transition towards the greater point you are making in your essay. This connects the short story part to the part where you explain what the experience has taught you about yourself, how you have matured from going through it, and how it has shaped the person that you are. Choose one of the three pivot options below.

Pivot Idea 1: Expand the Time Frame - you explain the lesson learned, realization that lead you to this point in your life.

"that was the moment I realized..."

"never again would I...."

Pivot Idea 2: Link the Described Experience with Others - draw a parallel between the life event that you've been describing in your very short story and other events that were similar in some significant way.

"now I see how x is really just one of the many x's I have faced..."

"in a way, x is a good example of the x-like situations I see daily..."

"and from then on every time I..."

Pivot Idea 3: Focus on a Trait or Value - you use the experience you've been describing to demonstrate its importance in developing or zooming in on one key attribute.

"I could not have done it without (characteristic), which has helped me through many other difficult moments...."

"this is how I came to appreciate the importance of (value) both in myself and in those around me..."

Paragraph 2: Describe your academic and non-academic achievements (extra-curricular). Bragging area without going over the top!

Paragraph 3: Goals and plans – What do you plan on taking? What lead you to this choice? How are you going to go about achieving this goal?

Paragraph 4: Why do you deserve the scholarship? How is it going to help you reach your goals? How will it make a difference?

Paragraph 5: Conclusion – To complete the essay, refer to the opening lines/event/experience in your introduction. Your last sentence should reflect and state the most profound lesson you have learned throughout your experience. Restate that it was "through this specific (you want to restate explicitly) experience" that you learned the specific lessons. Be sure to state specifically the lessons you learned and tie them into the big picture outlook. You can end with a quote as well but remember that if you do, you need to properly reference the author.

Autobiographical Essay Frame:

Introduction 3 parts:

- Sentence 1: a killer first line
- Body sentences: a detailed description of an experience from your life
- Pivot sentence(s): a pivot to the bigger picture, where you explain why and how this experience has shaped you, your point of view, or your values.

Sentence one: First Sentence Idea 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5

Body of the introductory paragraph: Develop a few (2-4) vivid sentences to elaborate on your first sentence. Detailed description of an event/experience from your life (introduced in sentence one).

Pivot sentence(s) – Pivot idea 1, 2, 3 (this can be 1-3 sentences)

Paragraph 2: Describe your academic and non-academic achievements (extra-curricular). Bragging area without going over the top!

Paragraph 3: Goals and plans – What do you plan on taking? What lead you to this choice? How are you going to go about achieving this goal?

Paragraph 4: Why do you deserve the scholarship? How is it going to help you reach your goals? How will it make a difference?

Paragraph 5: Conclusion – To complete the essay, refer to the opening lines/event/experience in your introduction. Your last sentence should reflect and state the most profound lesson you have learned throughout your experience. Restate that it was "through this specific (you want to restate explicitly) experience" that you learned the specific lessons. Be sure to state specifically the lessons you learned and tie them into the big picture outlook. You can end with a quote as well but remember that if you do, you need to properly reference the author.
